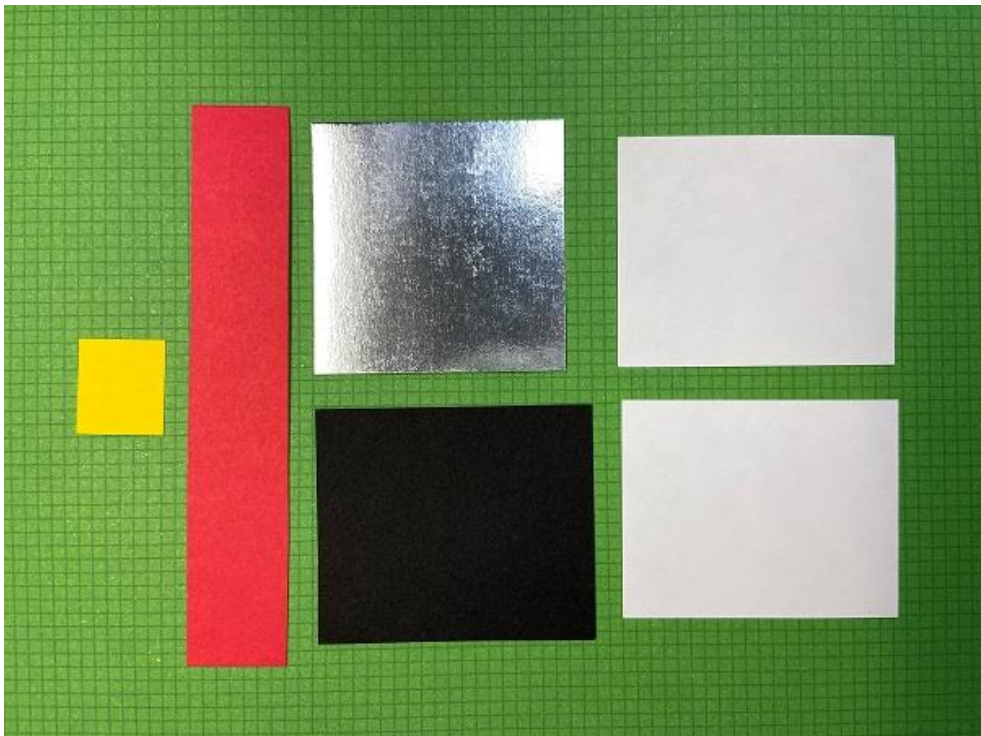


Let's Chill Greeting Card Craft

December's Greeting Card craft at West is super fun. It may seem a bit difficult, but that is what makes a homemade card so special; the little mistakes and quirks that show it was created by hand. So, don't strive to be perfect with this one; just have fun and put some love into it. Let's get started!

Materials needed: scissors, glue, ink pen or pencil, black marker or felt tip, scrap paper

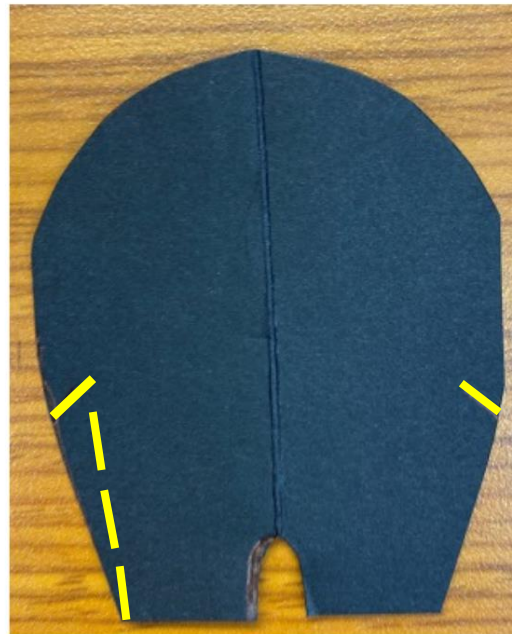
Materials included: colored paper, greeting card and envelope. Included is extra colored paper squares in case you make errors.



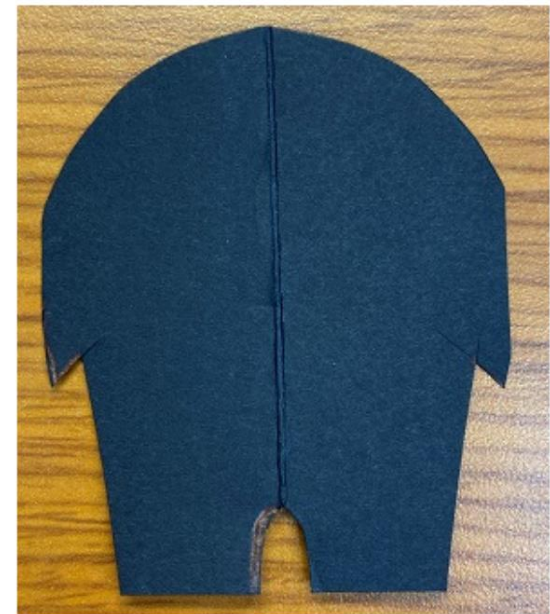
1. Fold the black paper in half, lengthwise. On the folded edge, draw an upside-down U. On the open edge, draw the edge of the penguin.



2. Unfold paper. On the outer edges, about halfway down, draw a little line for the wing.



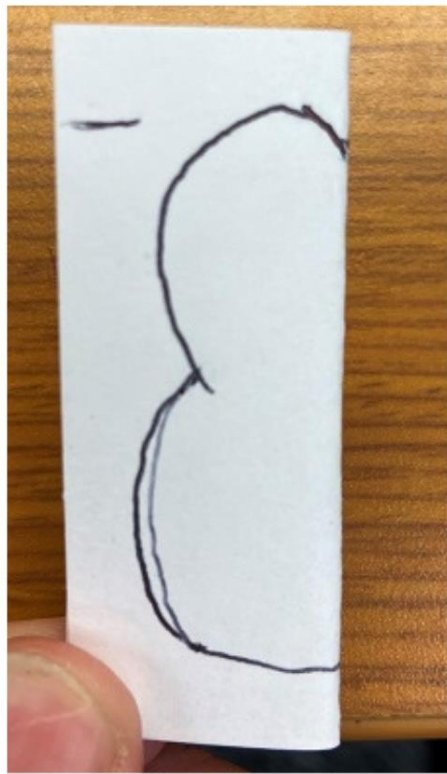
3. Cut on your wing lines. Then, cut from the outer corner of the penguin's feet up to the inner corner of the wing.



4. Lay the black piece over one of your white pieces. On your white paper, make a dot in between the penguin legs, and a little bit down from the top of the black piece.



5. Fold your white paper in half, and then make this shape; the folded edge is on the right. Make sure it points down at the top near the folded edge.



6. Cut the yellow piece into a little beak about the size of a pea.



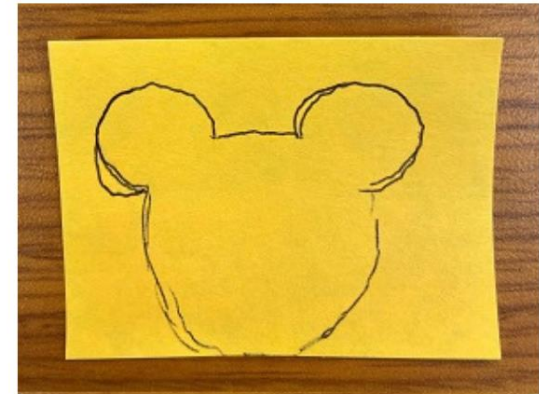
7. Glue the beak onto the white piece. glue the white piece onto the black piece. Make eyes on the penguin with your marker or pen.



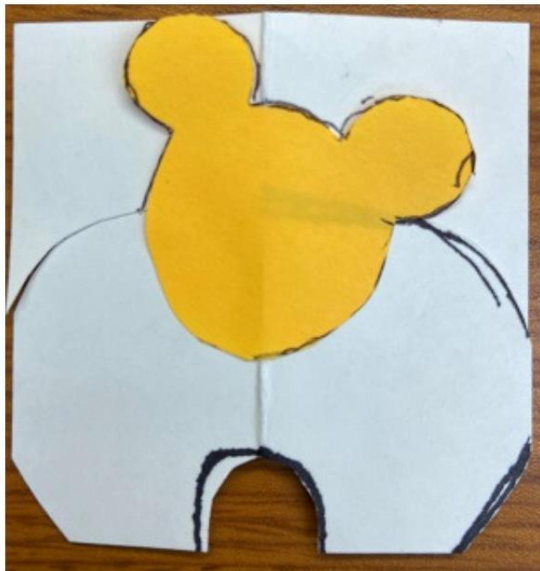
8. Fold your remaining white piece in half. Draw an upside-down U on the folded edge. Draw a diagonal line on the opposite corner, and then a curve about a third of the way down from the top edge.



9. On a piece of scrap paper, draw a bear head.



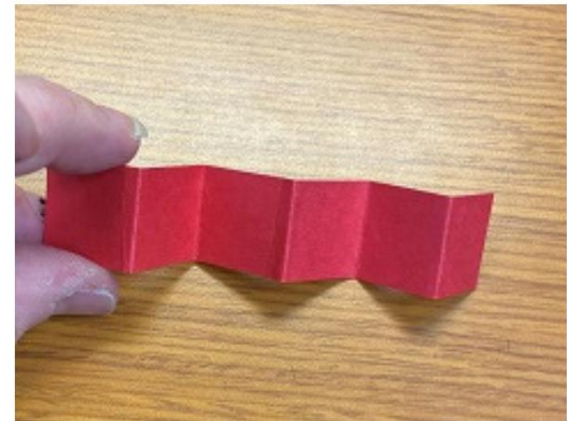
10. Set the bear head you traced on your unfolded white piece. Tilt the head a bit, at an angle, and trace around it.



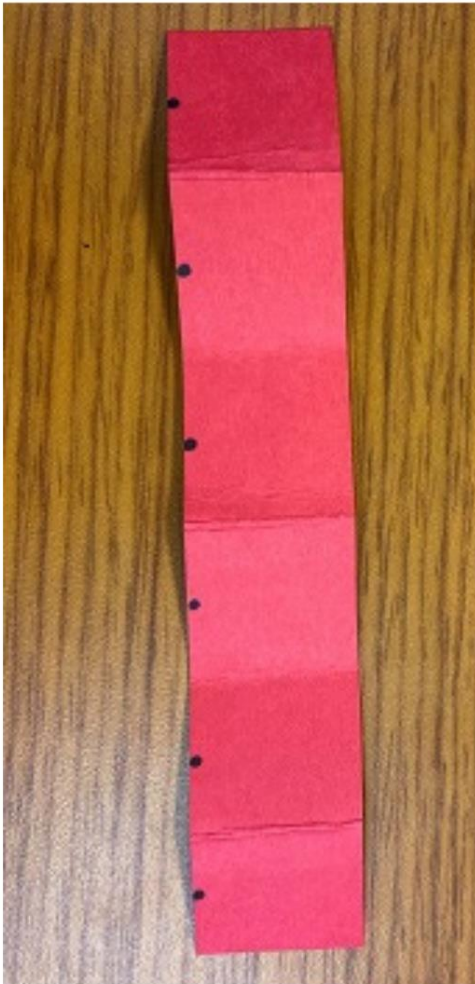
11. Turn the bear over so the pen marks are on the back. With marker, draw the bear head, eyes, nose, and ear accents.



12. Fold the red piece of paper in half, then fold into six even sections, accordion style.



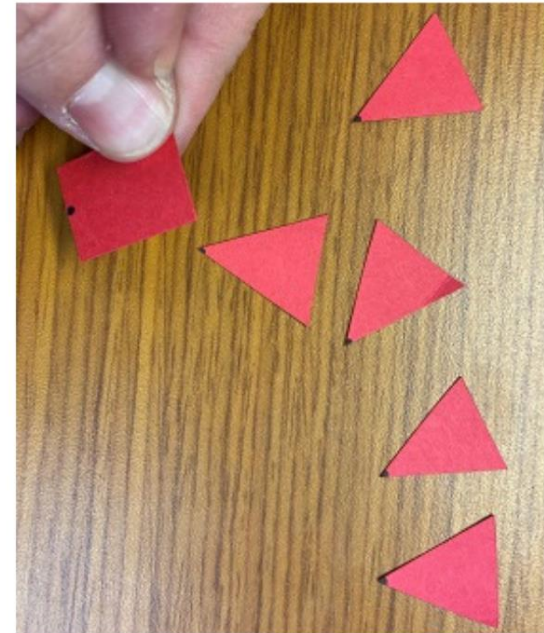
13. In the middle of each section, on one of the edges, make a dot in the center.



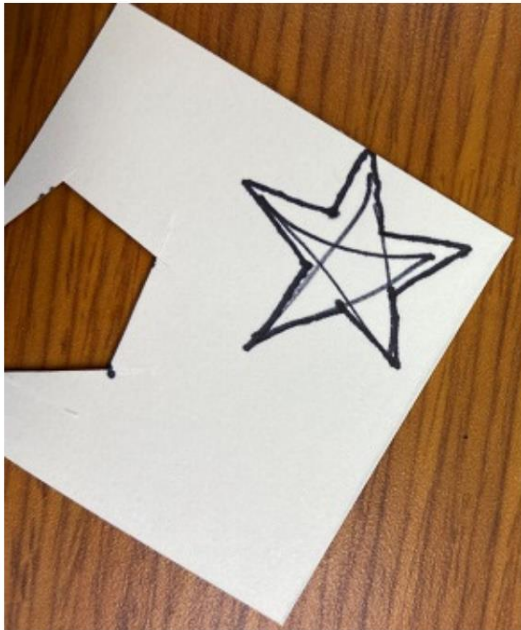
14. Cut where you have made the folds so you have 6 equal pieces.



15. On each individual piece, make a cut from the center dot you made to each opposite corner to create a triangle.



16. Turn your silver paper over. On the back, draw a star about the size of a quarter. If it's uneven, go back over it and fix the shape.



17. Glue all the pieces onto your green paper. Then, glue the green paper onto your greeting card.



18. Here is the finished product! Write Happy Holidays or whatever you want under the penguin and bear. Send to someone and don't forget to put the proper amount of postage.
